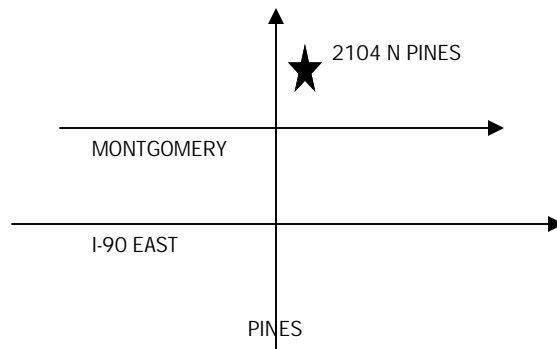

COCONUT PINEAPPLE CLUSTERS

Tip: You can use leftover cooked rice for this!

Shopping List

- 1 1/2 cups Minute white rice, uncooked
- 1 pkg (14 oz) flaked sweetened coconut
- 1 can (14 oz) sweetened condensed milk
- 1 can (8 oz) crushed pineapple, drained
- 1/3 cup flour
- 1 T. lemon juice
- 1 tsp grated lemon peel
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 1/2 tsp baking powder
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 1/2 cup semi-sweet chocolate chips
- Non-stick cooking spray
- Parchment paper

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Prepare rice according to package directions. Cool. Combine coconut, condensed milk, crushed pineapple, rice, flour, lemon juice, lemon peel, vanilla extract, baking powder and salt in large bowl; mix well. Drop by heaping tablespoonfuls onto baking sheet lined with parchment paper and lightly sprayed with non-stick cooking spray. Bake 18 to 20 minutes or until golden brown. Cool on baking sheet 5 minutes; remove cookies to wire racks. Cool completely. Melt chocolate chips according to package directions. Pour chocolate into a resealable plastic bag. Snip off a corner with scissors or a knife to make 1/8" hole; drizzle chocolate over cookies.

This is Cool! AUTO LICENSE PLATE READER --- Residents of the City of Spokane Valley may have noticed during the last year that the Spokane Valley Police Department has a uniquely-marked patrol car patrolling the streets of the city. What makes that vehicle so unique is it has two high-tech cameras attached to the roof of the car that can automatically read over 3,000 numbered plates per hour, while officers simply drive this vehicle down the road or through parking lots. This system is called the Automated License Plate Recognition (ALPR) System. The ALPR System uses a portable computer connected to a pair of cameras mounted on the roof of the patrol car. As officers drive down the street or through a parking lot, the cameras read license plates and then compare those numbers against a hot list of stolen vehicle license plates that are downloaded into the system daily. The hot list is a database containing license plate numbers of wanted vehicles or suspects linked to those vehicles. The database is updated twice a day by the FBI's National Crime Information Center and by law enforcement agencies that enter license plate numbers. Typically, in a single shift, an officer can manually check 50 to 100 license plate numbers. However, during the same shift, the ALPR System can check 3,000 plates or more. This not only has an amazing capability to help find stolen vehicles and stolen license plates, but it also has many other contributions that allows more efficiency in policing the city of Spokane Valley.

Last month we explored the state of Idaho. This month we will learn important facts about the state of Washington!

As part of the vast Oregon Country, Washington territory was visited by Spanish, American, and British explorers - Bruno Heceta for Spain in 1775, the American Capt. Robert Gray in 1792, and Capt. George Vancouver for Britain in 1792 - 1794. Lewis and Clark explored the Columbia River region and coastal areas for the U.S. in 1805-1806. Rival American and British settlers and conflicting territorial claims threatened war in the early 1840's. However, in 1846, the Oregon Treaty set the boundary at the 49th parallel and war was averted.
